

# Resources for researching the time period of the Second World War (1939-1945)

This guide is intended as a rough overview of the material within the British Jesuit Archives that might be useful for those researching the period 1939-1945 as well as those researching the Second World War in particular. It is by no means an exhaustive list, but rather serves as a guide highlighting some collections that it may be worth starting to look at.

There may be other resources in the British Jesuit Archives which contain information about this time and the Second World War. If you discover other sources during your research in the Archives, please notify a member of staff so that this list can be updated for the benefit of other researchers.

Where series have been catalogued the link to the online catalogue is provided and where resources have been digitised this has been indicated in the guide. Equally where personal papers are still within closure restrictions this is noted.

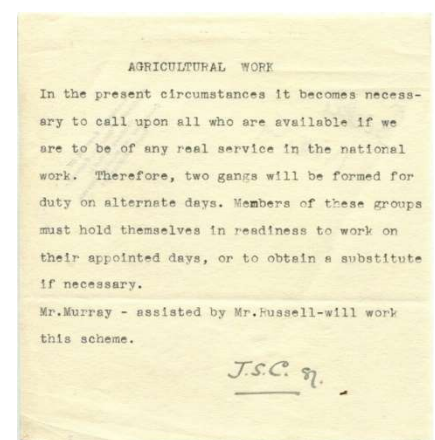


Figure 1 Notice in the Manresa Philosophers' Journal (ref. 24/4/2)

The following material may provide an insight into how Jesuit communities and ministries of the Jesuits, including parishes and schools, experienced the Second World War. In addition, there might be photographs but these are not yet listed.

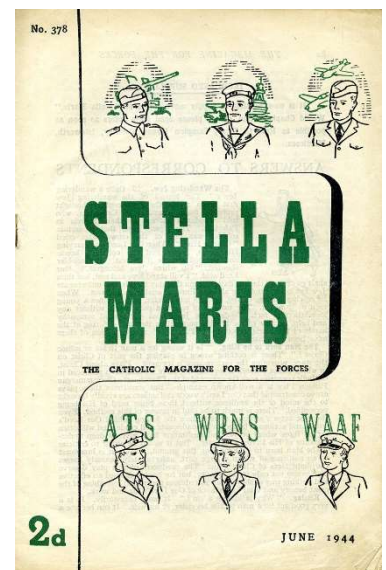


Figure 2 Stella Maris cover 1944

**INDIVIDUAL JESUITS**Provincial

Fr Francis Mangan SJ (1890-1964) was appointed Provincial 29 August 1939 and replaced by Fr Martin D'Arcy SJ on 2 August 1945. Fr Mangan's personal papers have not yet been

catalogued, but a scanned index card is available upon request. It should be noted there is very little material.

### Jesuit Military Chaplains

Jesuits belonging to the then English Province of the Society of Jesus served as chaplains in the Second World War in the British Army, Royal Navy and Royal Air Force.
